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MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE 31st ACADEMIC COUNCIL MEETING

Action Taken Report

All the five resolutions passed in the 30th Academic Council meeting have been implemented.

Resolution 31:01 / November 2022

Resolved to approve the course structure for UG programmes under Learning Outcome Based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) from 2023-2024 for a period of three years:

Part I Languages – 4 courses with 12 credits

Part II English – 4 courses with 12 credits

Part III Allied Course - 8 courses with 24 credits

Part III Core Course - 16 courses with 72 credits (without project) /

15 courses with 70 credits and a project with 2 credits /

15 courses with 68 credits and a project with 4 credits.

Part III Discipline Specific Electives - 3 courses with 12 credits

Part IV Generic Electives – 2 Courses with 4 credits

Part IV Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course - 3 Courses with 5 credits

Part IV Soft Skill Development - 1 Course with 2 credits

Part IV Experiential Learning - 1 Course with 2 credits

Part IV Skill Enhancement Course - 2 Courses with 2 credits

Part V Extension Activities – 1 credit

Part V Community Outreach Programme (JAMCROP) - Only Grades will be given

Extra Credit courses for advanced learners (optional)- 2 Courses

Extra Credit courses for all learners(optional)- 1 Course

Basic Tamil or Advanced Tamil (2 Courses each)

A total of 44 courses with an aggregate of 148 credits and 4400 Marks.

(Vide Enclosure – 1 Page. No. 18 – 20)

Extra Credit Courses: (Optional)

The advanced learners can opt for 2 Extra Credit courses, which are programme specific online courses and all the students can opt for any 1 online Extra Credit course for enhancing their additional skills. The credits earned for such courses will be added to the total credits of the programme. The credits will not be considered for CGPA.

Eligibility criteria for Extra Credit Courses (Advanced Learners):

Science programme: Minimum 75% Marks in the first four semesters for Extra Credit Course-I and 75% in the first five semesters for Extra Credit Course-II of Part – III courses for UG.

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Arts programme: Minimum 70% Marks in the first four semesters for Extra Credit Course-I and 70% in the first five semesters for Extra Credit Course-II of Part – III courses for UG.

Basic and Advanced Tamil

Basic Tamil and Advanced Tamil Courses are self-study Courses. The syllabi will be framed by the Department of Tamil and there is no CIA marks and End Semester Examinations will be conducted by the Controller of Examinations for 100 Marks.

A Basic Tamil Course is offered for the students who have not studied Tamil Language in their schools and college and an Advanced Tamil Course is offered for those who have studied Tamil Language in their schools but have opted for other languages under Part-I. These courses are mandatory for the students of the respective category. Marks earned will not be considered for total (or) CGPA.

Project Work:

The students shall be required to take up a group / individual project during the VI semester in the regular class hours and submit a report at the end of the semester. The Head of the Department shall assign the guide in the beginning of the III semester. The guide will suggest the project title to the students. The project will be evaluated by the project guide (Internal) and an external examiner nominated by the controller of examinations of our college.

Component for Evaluation of the project

Evaluation of Project report – 75 Marks

Viva-voce - 25 Marks

Components for viva voce:

Presentation - 15 marks

Response to queries raised by the examiners – 10 marks

Experiential Learning

Experiential Learning is a mandatory course for all the UG students. They can select any one of the options and may carry out the activity during semesters I-IV either outside the class hours or during summer / winter vacations

- a. Internship
- b. Industrial Visit / Field Visit
- c. Case Study / Survey

a. Internship

Students who opted internship have to undergo the same for a minimum of two weeks duration. At the end of the fourth semester, the student has to submit a detailed report along with a certificate of attendance from the organization where the internship was completed.

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b. Industrial / Field visit

Two Industrial / field visits should be carried out by the students in an organization / NGO. A report has to be submitted covering the two visits along with the attendance certificate from the organization / NGO concerned, at the end of the IV semester.

c. Case study / Survey

A maximum of two case studies / surveys have to be carried out by the students choosing any of the topics under current trends / social problems related to their discipline. An analysis report on the two case studies / surveys has to be submitted by the students, at the end of the IV semester.

The experiential learning course will be jointly evaluated by the subject teacher and an external examiner.

A minimum of 10 hours has to be spent in the allotted/ identified destination.

Grades will be awarded on the basis of participation, performance and behaviour. One of the Grades (A/B/C/D) shall be entered in the mark statement during semester IV as described below:

A: DISTINCTION B: VERY GOOD C: GOOD D: FAIR

Resolved to approve the course structure for all PG Programmes (including Extra credit courses and Community Outreach Programme (JAMCROP)) under LOCF from 2023 - 2024 for a period of Three Years.

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For Arabic, Botany, Chemistry, Commerce, Economics, English, History, Mathematics, Physics, Tamil and Zoology - a total of 15 Core Courses with 75 Credits, 4 Discipline Specific Elective Courses with 16 Credits, One Project with 4 Credits with 100 marks and a mandatory online course with 1 credit and 100 marks. A total of 19 Courses, one project and an online course with an aggregate of 96 credits and 2100 Marks.

For M. Sc. Biotechnology, Fashion Technology & Costume Designing, Microbiology and Nutrition & Dietetics - a total of 15 Core Courses with 75 credits, 3 Discipline specific Elective Courses with 12 credits, 1 project with 8 credits and 200 marks; and a mandatory online course with 1 credit and 100 marks. A total of 18 Courses, one project and an online course with an aggregate of 96 credits and 2100 Marks.

For M.Sc. Computer Science and M.Sc., Information Technology - a total of 14 Core Courses with 64 credits, 3 Discipline Specific Elective Courses with 12 credits, 1 project with 13 credits and 300 marks and a mandatory online course with 1 credit and 100 marks. A total of 17 Courses, one project and an online course with an aggregate of 90 credits and 2100 Marks.

For **M.B.A** - a total of 19 core courses with 72 credits, 8 Discipline Specific elective courses with 32 credits, 1 Internship with 2 credits and 100 marks, 1 project with 5 credits and 200 marks, 4 Comprehensive viva voce with 8 credits and 400 marks and a mandatory online course with 1 credit and 100 marks. A total of 27 Courses, one project, 4 Comprehensive viva voce, 1 Experiential learning course and an online course with an aggregate of 120 credits and 3500 Marks.

For M.C.A - a total of 19 core courses with 69 credits, 5 Discipline specific elective courses with 20 credits, 3 Skill Based Courses with 6 Credits, 1 project work with 12 credits, 1 mandatory online course with 1 credit. A total of 27 Courses, one project and an online course with an aggregate of 108 credits and 2900 Marks.

For **M.S.W** - a total of 16 core courses with 77 credits, 5 Discipline specific elective courses with 22 credits, 1 project with 4 credits and 100 marks and a mandatory online course with 1 credit and 100 marks. A total of 21 Courses, one project and an online course with an aggregate of 104 credits and 2300 Marks.

Mandatory Online Course for PG

All PG students must complete one mandatory online course during their programme period in any subject of their choice (online course under Extra credit cannot be included in this category). The credit(s) earned and the marks obtained will be converted to 1 credit and 100 marks respectively. The students who fail to complete the online course in the stipulated programme period will not be eligible to obtain their degrees.

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Extra Credit Courses for Advanced Learners: (Optional)

The advanced learners can opt for 2 Extra Credit courses, which are programme specific online courses for enhancing their additional skills. The credits earned for such courses will be added to the total credits of the programme. The credits will not be considered for CGPA.

Eligibility criteria:

Science programme: Minimum 75% Marks in the first two semesters for Extra Credit Course-I and 75% in the first three semesters for Extra Credit Course-II of Part – III courses for PG.

Arts programme: Minimum 70% Marks in the first two semesters for Extra Credit Course-I and 70% in the first three semesters for Extra Credit Course-II of Part – III courses for PG.

Jamal Mohamed College Community Reach Out Programme (JAMCROP)
