Action Taken Report of 24th Academic Council Meeting

The Resolutions from 24:1 to 24:05 of March 2019 passed in the 24th Academic Council Meeting in connection with the Value Added Courses, Revaluation norms, Instant Examination norms etc. were implemented.

Resolution 25:01 / October 2019

Resolved to approve the Programme Outcomes of Arts and Science for UG, PG, PG Diploma and M.Phil.

Resolution 25:02 / October 2019

- (i) Resolved to approve course structure for UG programmes with Programme Specific Outcomes under CBCS from 2020-21 for a period of three years:

Part I Languages – 4 courses with 12 credits

Part II English – 4 courses with 12 credits

Part III Allied – 8 courses with 21 credits

Part III Core – 16 courses with 67 credits

Part III Major Based Elective - 3 courses with 12 credits

- a) Students can undergo Internship at the end of Semester IV. These students will take up the Internship during the summer vacation and 15 working days in the fifth semester and submit a report to the Department concerned. **It is considered as a Core Course practical.** (or)

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	b) A student must spend a minimum of 30 hours in an Institute/ organization/ Industry / factory and should obtain a certificate from the authorities of the concerned organization. A report of the visit of the internship must be submitted to the Department as the case may be in the prescribed course structure. Marks will be awarded for Internship as per the allotment / Visit.	
	iv) Resolved to have End Semester Examination for all Part-IV and Part-V Courses without CIA Components for a maximum of 100 Marks in each paper.	
	Resolution 25:03 / October 2019 i) Resolved to approve course structure with Programme Specific Outcomes for the following PG Programmes under CBCS from 2020 -2021 for a period of Three Years. Arabic, Botany, Chemistry, Commerce, Economics, English, History, Mathematics, Physics, Tamil and Zoology making a total of 15 Core Courses with 69 Credits, 4 Core Based Elective Courses with 16 Credits, One Project with 4 Credit and a compulsory online course with 1 credit. A total of 19 Courses, one project and an online course with an aggregate of 90 credits and 2000 Marks. <i>(Vide Enclosure-3 Page No.25)</i> M.Sc Bio-Technology, Fashion Technology & Costume Designing, Microbiology and Nutrition & Dietetics making a total of 15 core courses with 69 credits, 3 core based elective courses with 12 credits, 1 project of 8 credits with 200 marks and a compulsory online course with 1 credit. A total of 17 Courses, one project and an online course with an aggregate of 90 credits and 2000 Marks. <i>(Vide Enclosure-5 Page No.26)</i>	

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ii)	Resolved to approve the course structure with Programme Specific Outcomes for M.B.A., M.C.A & M.S.W. Programmes. For M.B.A, making a total of 18 core courses with 73 credits, 8 core based elective courses with 32 credits, Summer Internship of 2 credits with 100 marks, 1 project of 4 credits with 200 marks, 4 Comprehensive viva voce of 8 credits with 400 marks and a compulsory online course with 1 credit. A total of 27 Courses, one project, 4 Comprehensive viva voce and an online course with an aggregate of 120 credits and 3300 Marks. (<i>Vide Enclosure-6 Page No.26</i>) For M.C.A, making a total of 30 core courses with 95 credits, 5 core based elective courses with 15 credits, 5 Skill Based Courses with 5 Credits, 2 summer projects with 4 credits, 1 Main project of 20 credits with 200 marks and a compulsory online course with 1 credit. A total of 40 Courses, 3 projects and an online course with an aggregate of 140 credits and 4400 Marks. (<i>Vide Enclosure-7 Page No.27</i>) For M.S.W, making a total of 16 core courses with 66 credits, 5 core based elective courses with 20 credits, 1 project of 3 credits with 100 marks and a compulsory online course with 1 credit. A total of 21 Courses, one project and an online course with an aggregate of 90 credits and 2200 Marks. (<i>Vide Enclosure-8 Page No.27</i>)	
	Online course for PG (Compulsory) by MOOC All PG students must complete one Online course by MOOC, during their course period in any subject of their choice (online course under Extra credit cannot be included in this category). The defaulters can attend campus e-learning course. The content of such course can be framed by the respective Chairman of Board of Studies comprising of the lessons / units/ topics of all semesters for designing 100 multiple choice questions covering all units of the programme. An Online examination can be conducted with a prescribed fee. Only after the declaration of the results of all semesters, a student can do the campus e-learning course. The students who fail /fail to complete the online course will loose the opportunity of getting their degrees in the stipulated course period.

An undergraduate student must select any one of them as first language. He should earn 12 credits (3 credits per semester in the first four semesters). Part I carries 400 marks in the first 4 semesters. PART-II: English Language Course (ELC) All the UG students shall go through this programme for the first four semesters. A student must earn 12 credits (3 credits per semester in the first four semesters). Part II carries 400 marks in the first 4 semesters. PART III: Allied Courses (AC) Besides Core Courses, an undergraduate student must study allied courses which may help to understand the Core Courses well. The students will study 8 papers of 5/4/3 credits each with 21 total credits carrying 800 marks. PART IV: Non Major Elective (NME) There are two courses - one in the III semester and one in the IV semester with 2 credits each. It is open to all students, irrespective of the Department. No student shall be permitted to select Non-Major Elective offered by the parent department. Students have to choose Non-Major Elective offered by other departments only.

- Minimum 70% Marks in the first four semesters for Extra Credit Course-I and 70 % in the first five semesters for Extra Credit Course-II of Part III courses for UG.
- Minimum 70% Marks in the first two semesters for Extra Credit Course-I and 70 % in the first three semesters for Extra Credit Course-II for PG.

Note:

- There should be no standing arrears for writing Extra Credit Courses (ie. Should have passed all papers at the time of filling up of examination application form)
- Students are not permitted to write the course as arrear, if he / she fails in the courses with extra credit.

Courses with Extra Credit for all the Learners:

In order to motivate all the students, the Extra credit courses are given for gaining more credits. According to the guidelines of UGC, the students are encouraged to avail this option of enriching by enrolling themselves in the Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC) **in any subject of their choice** provided by various portals such as SWAYAM, NPTEL etc. This can be availed by all the students and there is no minimum eligibility to take up this course by the UG students during their period of study (3 years).

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❖ End Semester Examination (ESE)-M.Phil - Each course shall have 75 marks for the End Semester Examination - Question papers for the end semester examination of Courses – I, II & III shall be set externally and valued by both external and internal examiners. - The guide paper (Course IV) shall be set and valued by the respective guide. - The candidate shall be declared pass the Courses I, II, III and IV, if he/she secures a minimum of 50 % marks, each in CIA and ESE. - The candidate is eligible to submit the dissertation only on completion of all theory papers successfully. Improvement in CIA marks for M.Phil programmes for the students admitted from the Academic Year 2019-2020 (Students admitted during and prior to 2018-19 shall refer Hand Book on Autonomy –Volume VI for old regulations) i. Students of M.Phil programmes who are unable to write the CIA -I with valid reason should get prior permission from the Tutor and HOD concerned and can write the CIA -I with a fee of Rs.200 per paper. Re-test request should be submitted to the COE's office within 15 days after the conduct of CIA -I. Applications submitted after the deadline will not be considered for the retest. There is no retest for CIA -II. No internal improvement will be permitted for those who secured 10 out of 25 or more marks in CIA. ii. Students who have failed in the CIA (secured less than 10 marks) are permitted to improve their CIA, on paying a fee of Rs. 500 per paper within 20 days of publication of End Semester Examinations results. Marks secured for the attendance in the particular semester shall be considered for CIA component. Note: M.Phil. Scholars who complete the Course in more than one attempt / exceeding the stipulated Course period, will be awarded Second Class with B Grade.		

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	❖ Dissertation - Candidates shall submit three copies of dissertation (two copies to the College and one copy to the guide) not earlier than 5 months from the date of commencement of the second semester in the case of Full-time programme and not earlier than 10 months from the date of start of the second year, in the case of Part-Time programme. The minimum and maximum page limit shall be from 75 to 150 pages respectively. The dissertation be printed on both sides of a paper and hard bound of the same is not necessary. - If a candidate is not able to submit his / her dissertation within the period stated above, he / she shall be given an extension time of 3 months in the first instance with a penalty of Rs.1500/- and another 3 months of second extension of time with penalty fees of Rs.3,000/- - If a candidate does not submit his / her dissertation even after the two extensions, his / her registration shall be treated as cancelled and he / she has to re-register for the programme. However, the candidate need not write the theory papers again, if he / she has already passed these courses. - An open Viva-Voce shall be conducted by both the external examiner and the supervisor and shall be attended by members of Department Research Committee, faculty members of the departments, other research scholars and other interested experts / researchers with a minimum of 30 members. RESTRICTION IN NUMBER OF CHANCES: Full – Time Candidates: No candidate shall be permitted to appear for the written Examination in any Course more than twice or to re-submit the dissertation or appear for the viva voce examination more than twice. Resubmission of a dissertation shall be done with penalty fee, within 6 months from the first of the month which follows the month in which the result of the first attempt is announced. The permitted attempts of semester-I & II Examinations shall be completed within a maximum period of 24 months from the first of the month which follows the month in which the registration was done.	

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Part – Time Candidates:

No candidate shall be permitted to appear for the written Examination in any Course more than twice or to re-submit the dissertation or appear for the vivavoce more than twice. Resubmission of a dissertation shall be done with penalty fee, within 6 months from the first of the month which follows the month in which the result of the first attempt is announced. The permitted attempts of Part-I & II Examinations shall be completed within a maximum period of 36 months from the first of the month which follows the month in which the registration was done.

RE-REGISTRATION:

- The candidates shall be permitted for Re-Registration based on the merit of individual cases.
- While Re-registering, the candidates shall pay the fees prescribed for Second Semester / year.
- The Re-Registration candidates are required to submit the dissertation not earlier than six months and not later than 1 year after the re-registration. No further extension of time shall be given.

Note:

- Supplementary Examinations for the theory courses shall be conducted depending upon the nature of the cases.

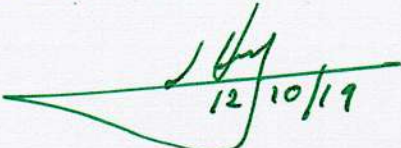
