Definition & Scope of Journalism

- Journalism means gathering and transmitting of news or information.
- Journalism means disseminating views of news, it means informing the public about the latest events.
- Journalist
 - Reporters are called journalist. They write about the people and for the people.

Role of the press:

 To inform, to instruct / to educate or to entertain

The Press council:

 The press council was constituted by the government of India in 1966

• The Press Laws:

- Soft news:
