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FIGURE OF SPEECH

Alliteration - Allusion - Simile - Metaphor - Personification - Oxymoron - Onomatopoeia - Anaphora - Ellipsis - Rhyme scheme - Rhyming words - Repetition - Apostrophe

DEFINITION:

A Figure Of Speech is a word or phrase that has a meaning something different than its literal meaning

1.ALLITERATION:

- Repetition of consonants or sounds at the beginning of two or more words in a line of poetry
- Ex: I spawn and splash in distant spills

2.ALLUSION:

- > A brief and indirect reference to a place, person or idea of historical culture, literary or political significance
- Ex: 1.He is a Romeo to every girl. Here Romeo refers William Shakespeare's famous character name in a play
 - 2. "Dust thou art, to dust returnest" alludes to Genesis 3:19

3.SIMILE:

- Two things are compared that are not really same, but to make a point about each other
- Ex: 1. I weep like a child for the past
 - 2. He is as strong as ox

4. METAPHOR:

- An implicit, implied or hidden comparison between two things that are unrelated but which share some common characteristics
- Ex: 1.The calm lake was a mirror
 - 2. The snow is a white blanket

5. PERSONIFICATION:

- Comparing Non-living things to living things
- Ex: 1.The stars in the sky blinked

(Non – living thing(The stars) compared to living thing behaviour (blinked))

2. The tulips nodded their head in the breeze

6.Oxymoron:

- Two words together seem to contradict each other
- Ex: 1.Original copy
 - 2. Clearly confused

7. ONOMATOPOEIA:

- Word sounds like what it means
- Ex: 1. The bees buzzed
 - 2. The rain went drip, drop, drip on the roof

8. RHYME SCHEME:

> The pattern of end rhymes in a poem. A separate letter of alphabet is used to mark off the rhyme scheme; ABBA, ABCCB

Ex: Upon a nice mid-spring day, A

Let's take a look at Nature's way, A

Breathe the scent of nice fresh air, B

Feel the breeze within your hair. B

Rhyme Scheme is – AABB

9. ANAPHORA:

- Repetition of the same word or group of words at the beginning of successive clauses
- Ex: 1. | came, | saw, | conquered
 - 2. I am getting better and better

10. ELLIPSIS:

- Omission of a word or a series of words
- Ex: Nancy can do something about problem but I don't know what (she can do)

Here, "She can do" is a omitted word.

11. RHYMING WORDS:

- Rhyming words are two or more words that don't start with same sound, but they end with same sound
- Ex: 1. Cat Sat Bat2. Ball Fall Tall

12. REPETITION:

- Repeating words, lines and phrases over again to stress the importance of idea
- Ex: Miles to go before I sleepMiles to go before I sleep

13. APOSTROPHE:

- Addressing someone, absent, dead or non-human as if that person or thing were present
- Ex: 1. Oh nature, thou art my goddess
 - · 2. Little Lamb, who made thee?
