What is Question Tag ...?

A Question Tag is a short question tagged (added) to a sentence asking for agreement or confirmation. (e.g) He will help us, won't he? 'won't he?' is a tag

What is Question Tag ...?

They are questions attached to the end of a statement **in order to draw attention to it or to give it added force.** (e.g) It is correct, <u>isn't it?</u>



Rule #1

If the statement is **positive**, the tag is **negative They are helpful**, <u>aren't they?</u>

If the statement is **negative**, the tag is **positive**. **They are not helpful**, <u>are they?</u>



Punctuation Marks

Comma (,) and Question mark (?)

Comma (,) is used at the end of the statement.
Question mark (?) is used at the end of the tag.

You are tired, aren't you?



Tag Structure #1

Negative Tag... *'auxiliary verb + n't +pronoun'* (the pronoun refers to the subject of the statement)

(e.g.) <u>It</u> is correct, *isn't* <u>it</u>? <u>Raja</u> is a good boy, *isn't* <u>he</u>?



Tag Structure #2

Positive Tag...

'auxiliary verb + pronoun' (the pronoun refers to the subject of the sentence)

(e.g) <u>It is not</u> correct, *is <u>it</u>?* <u>Raja is not</u> rich, *is <u>he</u>?*



CHANGES OF VERBS Main, Auxiliary & Modal Verbs

<u>1. Main Verb of 'Do'</u> They <u>work</u> hard, <u>don't</u> they? She <u>dances</u> well, doesn't she?

2. Auxiliary forms of 'Be' and 'Have' Kumar <u>is</u> sick, <u>isn't</u> he? Sudha <u>has</u> a car, <u>hasn't</u> she?

<u>3. Modal Auxiliary</u> You <u>can</u> do this, <u>can't</u> you? My brother <u>will</u> drop us, <u>won't</u> he?



Contracted Form

Only contracted form (short form) should be used in the tag but not the full form.

Can not = can't will not = won't shall not = shan't have not = haven't

But, am not = aren't

(e.g) I can help them, <u>can't I?</u> I am your neighbour, <u>aren't I?</u>



Negative Expressions

a) No, None, Never, No-one, Nothing, Nowhere, etc. are negative and hence the tag should be positive, as in the following examples.

(eg) None of the food was wasted, was it? We saw no-one we knew, did we?

b) Little, few, hardly, scarcely, rarely, and seldom are treated as negative and take a positive tag.

(eg) Few people know the answer, do they? Little progress has been made, has it?

c) Though 'few' and 'little' are negative 'a few' and 'a little' are positive, and therefore take a negative tag.

(eg) A few students knew the answer, don't they? A little progress has been made, hasn't it?



Useful to remember...

a) 'Let us' sentence – tag is 'shall we?' Let us go for a walk, shall we? .b) Verb+other words – tag is 'will you? or 'won't you?" Do this work, will you? Help him to open, won't you? c) <u>Everyone</u> has come, haven't <u>they</u>? d) Many of us wanted to stay longer, didn't we? e) Some of you are learning English, aren't you? f) There is a clinic in this area, isn't there? g) There are many shops in this area, aren't there?
