Introduction

The Imperfect tense. الفعل المضارع, conveys the meaning of the present and the future tense. But due to the addition of certain particles before it, the meaning of مضارع undergoes a change, and sometimes change occurs not only in the meaning but also in the word. As mentioned earlier, the addition of مضارع and س before مضارع converts it into the future tense.

Changes in the Meaning of Imperfect

The Imperfect المضارع has five "moods", which are identified by the vowel of the third radical. In this respect it resembles the noun with its three case-endings.

The simplest use of a verb is to make a statement of fact, or ask a question. But a verb may also be used to express a command, or to express a mere supposition or a wish. These different manners in which a verb may be used to express an action are called "moods".

The Imperfect المضارع has five "moods"; namely, the Indicative, Subjunctive, Jussive or Conditional, Imperative and Energetic.

The Indicative and Imperative "moods" have been dealt with in lessons 16 and 17 respectively.

PARTICLES WHICH CHANGE THE MEANING OF THE IMPERFECT

There are three groups of particles which place either — or — or "the of emphasis" at the end of the imperfect. With this addition it is called (1) المضارع المجزوم (2) the Subjunctive (2) المضارع المجزوم (3) the Jussive and (3) المضارع مسع نسون التساكيد the Energetic of the Imperfect. But in the absence of any of these particles normal الفعل المضارع the Imperfect will end with "Damma" —.

There are certain verbs and particles which, when introduced at the beginning of a nominal sentence, bring about certain vowel changes in respect of their subject and predicate. Verbs of Incomplete Predication i.e. كان and its categories الأقعالُ الثَّاقِصة are discussed in this lesson.

The Verbs of Incomplete Predication * الأفعَالُ النَّاقِصة * express the idea of becoming or state of continuation. When it is said كان أحمد Ahmad was, the person who hears this expression might as well ask: "What was Ahmad?". But, when it is stated كان أحمد تاجر أ Ahmad was a merchant, the predicate is complete. This nominal sentence is analysed thus:

 الفعل الناقص is the verb of incomplete predication أحمد - إسم كان is the subject of Kana تاجرا - خبر كان is the predicate of Kana تاجرا

According to the rules governing the subject and predicate in a nominal sentence, the vowels of the last letter of the two should be the same (see lesson No.9). But when كان and the verbs which fall under this category are added at the beginning of a nominal sentence:

- 1. The subject of کان will be in the nominative case: مَرْفُوع
- 2. The predicate of كَانَ will be in the accusative case: منْصُوب

- a) are not in frequent use
- b) nor are they used in their exact literal sense.

Nouns and its varieties have been dealt with in the earlier lessons of this book. The discussion in this lesson concerns nouns derived from the verbs, which come very near to Gerunds and Participles in English.

Arab grammarians have classified Nouns into three groups.

The nouns which the Arab grammarians call إسم الفاعل Active participle and إسم المفعول Passive participle, are verbal adjectives, i.e. adjectives derived from verbs and nearly correspond in meaning to what are known as participles in the English language. A nominal sentence which consists of a subject and a predicate generally has either of these as predicate.

1. THE ACTIVE PARTICIPLE إسم الفاعل

It denotes the person who does the act or is responsible for it. It is formed from the verb in the past tense, 3^{rd} person, by adding *Alif* after the first radical and adding *kasrah*— to the second radical, i.e. in the form of adding kasrah.

This is formed from the intransitive verbs. It expresses a quality inherent and permanent in a person or thing without any limitation. It is used to convey a certain degree of intensity. In this respect it is slightly different from the active participle. e.g.

LESSON TWENTY-FOUR Derived Forms of the Verb الفعل المجرد والمزيد

The great majority of the Arabic verbs are triliteral, i.e. they consist of three radical letters only. The quadriliteral verbs, which consist of four radical letters are less in number.

The triliteral verbs are of two kinds:

- (1) Those which contain merely three radical letters which are known as خرج . الثلاثي المجرد to go out.
- (2) Those which contain one, two or three additional letters besides the three radical letters. These are known as الثلاثي e.g. المزيد فيه to send out. These in fact are "the derived forms of the triliteral verbs". They differ from the original, in meaning to some extent. In the Arabic dictionaries, the triliteral verb is listed first and the meanings of its derived forms follow one after another.

There are twelve forms of triliteral verbs.
